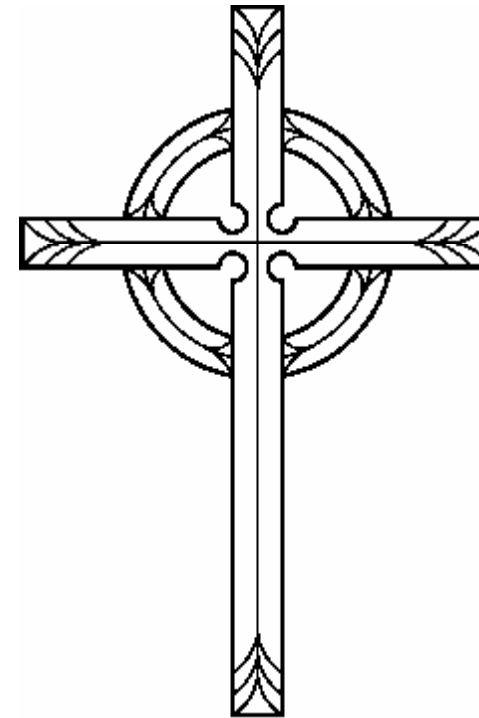

Foundations of Faith (Lounge)
